## 2010 St Gregory

We have named our first premium release St Gregory for two reasons. Bishop Gregory O'Kelly visited our vineyard in 2001 and blessed our newly planted vines. Secondly in 2013 Pope Francis honoured our founder, Graham Spurling, with a papal knighthood of the Order of St Gregory the Great in recognition of his dedicated work to the Catholic Church. Awarding of these ancient titles is rare, as is our 2010 St Gregory wine - we produced only 100 cases.

The 2010 season was one of those rare near perfect years where the fruit ripened evenly, and produced great colour and flavours. There was a small corner of the Bundaleer block where the fruit looked even better than the rest so we made the decision to harvest it separately and keep it aside for our first ever "Reserve" wine. We fermented the parcels of Shiraz and Cabernet separately, and then aged them in new French oak for 30 months with minimal intervention, before blending them into the classic Aussie blend.

The colour is a deep red hue with the nose showing lifted red berry fruit notes. The palate has a lovely balance of fruit and oak with a lingering soft finish that leaves you wanting more.

To enhance your enjoyment of this wine we recommend decanting before serving. The St Gregory will benefit from 5 to 10 years in the cellar.....if you can wait.

The label is designed to depict three circles of stone walls seen throughout the Bundaleer Forest. To us they represent three loves that are important to all of us at Bundaleer - the love of the land, love of family and love of wine. The ring shape also represents the tree stump rings that can be found throughout the nearby forest.
